### Elwood Conservation Club Archery Range Rules

#### Members and Registered Guests Only

L This archery range is open to members and registered guests of the Elwood Conservation Club.

#### YOU are Responsible for Safe Operation

- 2. Members and registered guests are solely responsible for safe use of this archery range. Failure to follow these rules may result in ...
- A. Severe injury to the archer or bystanders.
- B. Loss of privilege of use of the archery range.

#### Do Not Fire or Handle Equipment While Any Person is Down Range

3. Archers on the firing line must hang (on provided pegs), or lay to the ground archery equipment when any individual is down range beyond the firing line.

#### Ensure that the Lanes and Firing Line are Clear

4. Check surroundings before firing archery equipment. Tree limbs or other objects may obstruct the action of the equipment, which may result in either injury to archer, bystanders, or may cause the arrow to miss the target.

#### Point Archery Equipment Down Range

5. Archery equipment must only be drawn and pointed down range towards the constructed targets while on the firing line.

#### Target Arrowheads Only: Broadheads/Blunt Arrowheads Not Allowed

6. Only target arrowheads are permitted for use with targets provided by the Elwood Conservation Club. Neither broadhead arrowheads (fixed blade or mechanical), nor blunt arrowheads (e.g. judo points), are permitted. The use of "pre-season", unsharpened broadhead arrowheads is also prohibited. Violation of this rule may result in a chargeback to the archer for the full cost of the archery targetls) and/or loss of privilege to use the archery range.

#### Do Not Use Damaged Equipment, Bolts, or Arrows

7. Inspect equipment, and bolts or arrows for damage before shooting. Firing damaged archery equipment, bolts, or arrows may result in serious injuries.
☐ Inspect bolts or arrows for cracks, loose vanes, bends, broken nocks or any condition that may cause the bolt or arrow to fly erratically or to rupture when released.

□ Inspect archery equipment for frayed strings, loose pulleys, warped limbs, cracks or other damage that may result in breakage when at full draw.

8. Never dry fire archery equipment. The resistance of a bolt or arrow is needed to prevent damage to the limbs.

### Do Not Use Archery Equipment that is Mismatched to Bolts, Arrows, or the Archer

- 9. Only fire bolts or arrows that have been properly matched to the draw length and spine requirements of the archery equipment.
- 10. Never draw a bow that was set up for someone else. Draw lengths and weights vary. A person with a 32 inch draw length drawing a bow with a 28 inch draw can cause a bow limb to rupture with sufficient force to cause injury. Additionally, drawing an arrow that is too short may cause the arrow to slip behind the handle, effectively blocking forward travel, rupturing the arrow and causing serious injury to the archer or bystanders.
